## A BRIEF HISTORY OF Elizabeth Edgar Hall

Elizabeth Edgar Hall opened on West Beaver Street in downtown Jacksonville in the early 1900s as a nonprofit boarding house for single career women who could not otherwise afford safe lodging. In the 1970s, proceeds from the sale of the hall were put into a trust fund to provide loans to local women attending Jacksonville post-secondary schools. In 1991, the foundation switched from making educational loans to the current practice of granting scholarship awards.

Awards range from \$500 to \$2,000. Types of scholarships include:

-  The **ELIZABETH EDGAR HALL SCHOLARSHIPS**  
*(approximately 13 each year)*
-  The **DELLA M. LEVY SCHOLARSHIP**,  
named for one of the Foundation's  
most ardent supporters
-  The **ISABELLE V. KING SCHOLARSHIP**,  
for secondary education majors —  
in memory of Jacksonville educator  
and former EEH Board Member  
Isabelle V. King
