From the board meeting notes on October 13, 1966 when Elizabeth Edgar Hall was a boarding house for women, located at 119 W. Beaver St. in Jacksonville: Mrs. Sorrel read her report. There are 9 girls in residence with 2 more expected. Four girls were married during the summer, one of whom held her reception at the Home. Clifford Beaman from the Fellowship Baptist Church conducted Vespers and gave a most interesting "chalk talk."

Author Speaks at EEH Scholarship Reception

Thelma Young was the featured speaker at the annual reception to honor EEH scholarship recipients, which was graciously hosted by the College of Education and Human Services at UNF on November 15, 2006. Ms. Young is the author of *The Stories My Foremothers Told Me*, an oral history of the experiences of five Black-Creole Catholic women living on the Mississippi-Louisiana Gulf Coast from the days of Jim Crow into the 21st Century. The five women are Young's mother, three aunts, and an elderly cousin. "Thelma Young's talk was moving and inspirational," said Marion Tischler. "I started her book last night and forgot to turn on my alarm for this morning."

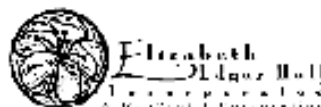
